Seattle Foundation: Standing for equity and opportunity for all

Seattle Foundation ignites powerful, rewarding philanthropy to make Greater Seattle a stronger, more vibrant community for all. Focused on creating equity and opportunity, the Foundation works to simplify giving and strengthen the impact of philanthropy for the more than 1,200 individuals, families, businesses and nonprofits it serves. In addition, Seattle Foundation annually presents GiveBIG, a 24-hour, on-line giving event to raise funds for area nonprofit organizations.

Connecting philanthropists with community organizations and opportunities, Seattle Foundation channels resources to nonprofits that are creating positive change and addressing challenges in our region. The Foundation catalyzes public, private, community and philanthropic investment — of funding, knowledge and people — to support promising long-term initiatives aimed at advancing social change and creating real impact for the people of Greater Seattle.

One of the greatest challenges in the region is the rising economic inequality and continued racial inequities that are creating two Seattles. These two Seattles have vastly different experiences of the region, with large gaps in well-being, education, quality of life, health and more. Through philanthropy, Seattle Foundation is working to address that widening disparity so that everyone shares in the community's collective prosperity.

The Foundation's approach is to focus on systems change, with people at the center of the work, to reduce these disparities. It aims to change policies and practices that are root causes of chronic community challenges, in partnership with the private, public and social sectors. A few of the Foundation's



efforts to increase opportunities and equity for all in Greater Seattle include:

Seattle Schools Arts Plan. Working in a public-private partnership, Seattle Foundation supports The Creative Advantage, the arts plan of Seattle Public Schools, to ensure that all students in the district have the opportunity to learn through the arts, helping them achieve success in school and in life.

The Voter Education Fund. Working with King County Elections, the fund is providing \$400,000 to local nonprofits that execute strategies to increase voting participation in historically underserved or low voting populations. The grants will be distributed through a competitive process and evaluation.



Assistance for refugees and immigrants. In partnership with the City of Seattle, the Foundation is committing funds to assist immigrant and refugee children

in Seattle Public Schools and their families with counseling, legal services and community education forums that share information about immigrant rights and resources.

As a civic leader, Seattle Foundation brings together philanthropists, community leaders, academics, practitioners and, most importantly, residents, to explore new ways of thinking about community needs and pathways to greater opportunity. This leadership has launched numerous high-impact programs and nonprofits, including The Roadmap Project, SkillUp Washington, Parent-Child-Home Program and, most recently, Seattle Region Partnership.

The Foundation began in 1946 when Seattle business leader Dr. Richard Fuller, who founded the Seattle Art Museum and helped start the Pacific Science Center, worked with other community leaders to enrich life here. In that first year, the Foundation raised \$289,000 for an endowment and distributed \$8,000 in grants.

Now, the Foundation oversees nearly \$1 billion in charitable assets and committed bequests, and invests more than \$100 million in grants annually to nonprofit organizations that are working to make Greater Seattle a more vibrant and equitable place, with opportunity for all.

This work is informed by seven decades of effective philanthropic advising, deep community knowledge, powerful civic leadership and judicious stewardship of assets on behalf of Greater Seattle.

How you living? Gallup reveals which grads live the good life

Some graduates handle the transition from college to career better than others. New research reveals which group of grads have made that shift most successfully.

According to a recent Gallup study, graduates from Western Governors University (WGU) are twice as likely as alumni of other institutions to experience higher levels of overall well-being.

So, what exactly is well-being for college graduates? It's happiness, health, wealth and so much more.

To untangle that dynamic web of factors, Gallup and Healthways teamed up to create the Well-Being 5. They call it a "scientific survey instrument" and "the most complete measurement of well-being in the industry."

The Well-Being 5 calculates contentment based

on five elements: purpose, social, financial, community and physical. They're all interconnected, and — when studied — can show who is really living the good life.

In each well-being category, WGU alumni top college grads nationwide in the percentage who are thriving. (Gallup rates respondents' well-being in each category as "thriving," "struggling" or "suffering," based on their responses.)

The biggest spread between WGU graduates and other college alums was found in purpose well-being. Most WGU grads (59 percent) are thriving in that area — meaning they enjoy what they do each day and are motivated to achieve their goals. That's compared with 43 percent of college graduates nationally and public college graduates, 45 percent of private



not-for-profit graduates, 33 percent of private for-profit graduates and 40 percent of nontraditional college

graduates.

The same Gallup study revealed WGU alumni are almost twice as likely to be

emotionally attached to their university than alumni from other universities — demonstrating that personal

connections are possible in distance learning.

"WGU grads are twice as likely as other college graduates to say they had a mentor who encouraged their goals and dreams," said Brandon Busteded, Gallup's Executive Director, Education and Workforce Development. "Given that Gallup has found this to be the single strongest element linked to long-term success in career and life, it's a hugely positive outcome. It's not about simply having an advisor who provides course selection tips. WGU grads are being inspired and encouraged around their life goals and dreams."

Solid Ground empowers voices to end poverty

Homelessness is traumatic and viciously complex. Solid Ground believes that ending poverty requires both direct service *and* grassroots advocacy led by those most affected by poverty.

Over 10 years ago, Susan Russell was a successful union cement mason. But when her car was rear-ended by an uninsured motorist, her resulting injuries led to a lost job and depleted savings, and Susan was forced onto the streets.

“When you are in that headspace, you’re just frantic,” Susan remembers. “My brutal PTSD came as a result of being homeless and living on the street for almost 10 years.”

After years of living without a home, Susan was referred to Solid Ground and moved into transitional housing on its Sand Point Housing campus.

Susan remembers, “When I finally got accepted, I’d been in survival mode for a long time. I barricaded my door to fall asleep, because every time I fell

asleep, something bad happened to me. It took me about a year to find peace from the craziness violence does to you.”

Last fall, Susan found permanent housing with Solid Ground. She says, “Solid Ground gave me a space to heal — a place to call home — and I’ve found the power within me to be a strong advocate for change.”

While raising her voice on behalf of Seattle’s authorized encampment in Ballard, Susan encountered an angry mob, which led to a powerful catharsis.

Susan recalls, “People were so mean. They were angry and disparaging of people without homes, saying ‘those people, those people.’ But it’s *we*. The only difference was some people had a home and some didn’t.”

“I called my friend Denise and said, ‘I think we should do something to create beauty and let everyone know that love lives here.’”

Thus the Love Wins Love Unity Flag

project was born, sparking courageous conversations between people with housing and those without it.

“After 10 years, I finally found my home at Solid Ground,” Susan says.

Childhaven program strengthens family bonds

With a video camera on, Gabby Tittel and her son, Christian, play together in their apartment. A game of peek-a-boo and chase involving a tent and favorite toy soon has the 2½-year-old bubbling over with laughter.

Gabby is participating in a Childhaven program that uses videotaping and positive feedback to help parents build secure and positive relationships with their young children. The program is based on research that shows that healthy brain development depends on the first relationships babies have with their parents and caregivers. These bonds become the foundation for the child's social and emotional growth, including how they see themselves and how they treat others.

"Those early attachments are so significant," says Nell

Robinson, Program Innovation Manager at Childhaven. "When parents understand how to sensitively respond to their children, the relationship grows stronger and more secure."

The 10 weekly sessions are conducted in the family's home and are aimed at reinforcing strengths as well as helping parents understand what social and emotional needs might be driving their child's behavior. A trained Childhaven professional videotapes the parent and child interaction for 15 minutes, then replays the video for the parent, asking questions and pointing out things the parent is doing right. So many of these parents have been under a "microscope of negativity" that it's good for them to hear about the positive things they're doing.

The experience has been a

real confidence booster for Gabby. She says she's grateful to Childhaven for so much, from the donated clothes and toys she gets to the therapeutic child care Christian receives at Childhaven.

"I think the 'ah ha' moment for me was when I realized that I'm actually a good mom," she says. "I didn't have that self-esteem or confidence. I was just sort of winging it as a parent. With Childhaven's positive feedback, they're showing me I'm actually on the right track."

Northwest Harvest has been making an impact for 50 years

In the spring of 1967, a group of local social activists saw a pressing need in our community.

They saw men and women struggling to provide enough food for their families each week. So, they did what activists do — they acted. They gave birth to what became Northwest Harvest, a hunger-relief agency specifically created to provide food for those in need.

During these past 50 years, so much of the landscape in the Northwest has changed — both literally and figuratively. But one thing has stayed the same: Many of our neighbors still struggle with hunger. And Northwest Harvest continues to take action.

Today, Northwest Harvest is the leading independent hunger-relief agency in the state. It focuses on building partnerships in communities across Washington to better provide food where it's most needed.

In its first 50 years, Northwest Harvest has provided over 500 million meals in Washington through its statewide network of more than 375 food banks, meal programs and high-need schools.

A craving worse than hunger

Blakeley saw more than stars the day her boyfriend broke her nose in public. She saw hate in the twisted mouth that said he loved her. She saw death in a needle poisoning her life. She saw indifference in a parking lot filled with people looking the other way.

Blakeley was desperate with a craving worse than hunger. She felt a life stir inside her. She knew she needed a way out. She called 2-1-1 and was referred to KentHOPE.

“I was just going somewhere I could stay and get well, and then go get high again with my boyfriend,” Blakeley said. “But I went and these people loved on me. I came in bruised up and so skinny you couldn’t even tell I was pregnant. But they didn’t judge me.”

Mychelle at KentHOPE told Blakeley that she had also lost her kids to drugs and domestic violence. Then she graduated from Seattle’s Union Gospel Mission’s program at Hope Place and got them back. “She said that if she could do it, I could too.”

That’s when Blakeley enrolled in the Mission’s program.

“My first meal was macaroni and cheese with chicken and this really good Jell-O,” she said. “It wasn’t just slop; it was home

cooked. They treated us like queens. It was like home for me.”

At Hope Place, women are loved without condition and learn coping mechanisms in counseling as they recover from addiction.

After graduating from the year-long program, Blakeley said, “I’ve never finished anything in my life. I’ve always opted out if it got too hard. This is a big milestone.”

Blakeley sees more than stars today. She sees herself clean and sober. She sees herself being a good mom to her daughters who live with her. She sees a future helping women like herself: women who need to be seen, loved, and who need hope.

How do we recognize the face of hunger?

When you're driving to work and you see tents and encampments along the freeway, you know that someone is homeless. When you see a person having a manic episode on a downtown street, you can be fairly sure that person is suffering from mental illness. But how do we know when someone is hungry?

"You can't," says Linda Nageotte, President and CEO of the hunger-relief group Food Lifeline. "Hunger is an invisible problem, that's what makes it so difficult to solve."

Nageotte has been with Food Lifeline for 19 years. Last year, her group fed more than 800,000 Western Washington residents. That's a staggering number when you consider the entire

population is just over 5 million. That translates to one in seven people visiting a food bank last year. For children, it's one in five.

"The physical signs of hunger in children can look a lot like lack of sleep, or a common cold," Nageotte says. "Hunger may be the last thing anyone thinks of."

While Seattle may currently have the hottest economy in the country, the proverbial "rising tide" doesn't always lift all boats.

"There are still families that are struggling. They're in a financial situation where even a car repair can force them to choose between food and transportation," says Nageotte.

But if we can't see the problem, how can we help? Nageotte says lending a

hand on a regular basis helps assure that food is available when most needed.

"The best way to help is to volunteer your time," she says. "Just helping us sort and repack food a few hours a month is invaluable. We created 32 million meals last year with the help of 10,000 volunteers. That's the best way to move food."

Donors make the most of GiveBIG

John Joynt is a night owl, so it's not unusual for him to be awake long after many have gone to sleep. But once a year, Joynt uses his late-night wakefulness to be generous, making sure he is online at midnight, credit card in hand, to support an assortment of nonprofit organizations through GiveBIG.

"I like trying to be amongst the first official GiveBIG donors," said Joynt, who is director of information technology at the nonprofit National CASA. "The early giving option has taken some of that magic away, but I still like being there when the virtual doors open on GiveBIG. It's become kind of a tradition."

A GiveBIG donor for six years, Joynt is one of the nearly 45,000 people who participate in Seattle Foundation's annual day of online

giving. The event, now in its seventh year, unites Seattle Foundation, nonprofit organizations and donors in a campaign that has collectively raised more than \$75 million.

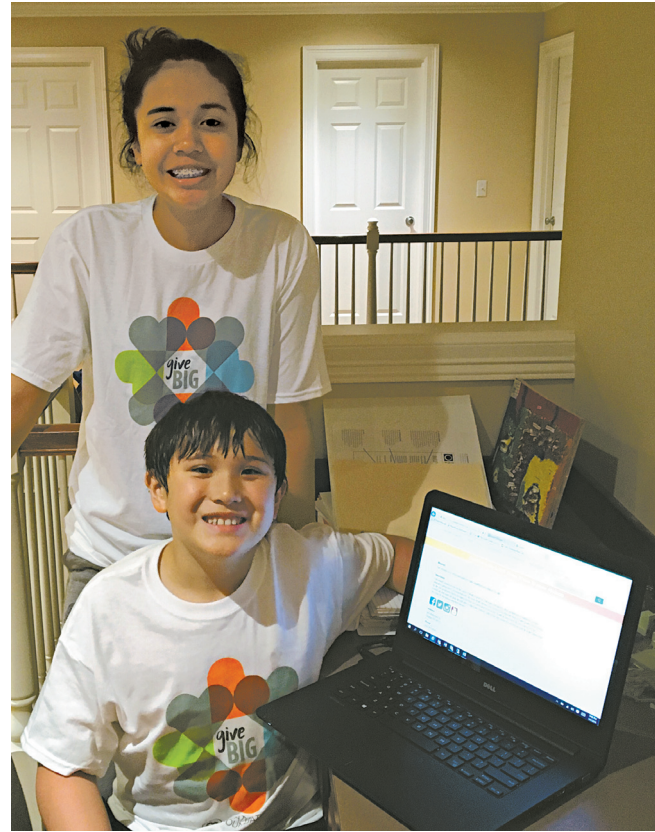

Joynt's history with GiveBIG started when he was a board member of the Northeast Seattle Little League and the organization didn't yet have the ability to accept online donations for its annual fundraising event. He paired GiveBIG with the event and supporters were allowed to conveniently donate by credit card. It was a home run in generating funds for the league.

Since then, Joynt and his wife, Marisol, have used GiveBIG to support a wide array of nonprofits including their children's schools, Xeno, and many other smaller organizations that are not a part of their usual giving plan.

When GiveBIG launched in 2011, just over 12,600 people made online gifts. This year, the Foundation expects to top 50,000 donors, according to Mary Grace Roske, vice president for marketing and communications. The average donor gives to two nonprofits, although many donors give to many more.

"One year, a donor made individual contributions to more than 50 nonprofits," recalled Roske. Each donation required a separate credit card transaction. The Foundation now offers a "giving

cart" so that donors can support as many nonprofits as they want in one simple transaction.

Roske said while it's always great to see the GiveBIG dollar totals grow year to year, the Foundation cares most about donor and nonprofit participation. "The magic of the day comes from more people giving and more

nonprofits engaging. It's the donors and nonprofits that have made GiveBIG the third largest giving day in the country."

Families have also found GiveBIG a useful way to engage their children in philanthropy. Elaine Chu and her husband, Ken, of Maple Valley, encourage their children to use the GiveBIG website

to learn about their community and find interesting nonprofits to support.

In 2016, Emily, 13, and Ethan, 10, each selected an area of interest from Seattle Foundation's Healthy Community Framework, which is a structure designed to help people think about community and philanthropy. It presents eight elements of a healthy community: arts and culture, basic needs, economic opportunity, education, environment, global giving, health and wellness and vibrant communities.

Emily's interest was in health and wellness, while Ethan focused on education. Each identified a handful of nonprofits and selected one to support; Emily chose the American Cancer Society, and Ethan donated to Books of Joy, a small nonprofit that supports children's education in marginalized communities.

They used their allowance to make gifts of \$25 each and their parents matched the gifts to bring their total individual donation to \$50.

"The kids did a lot of exploring on the website and they made us aware of many worthy organizations, particularly smaller ones," said Elaine. "We tend to stick to the tried and true nonprofits that we know, but this experience opened our eyes to community needs and nonprofits we didn't know of before."

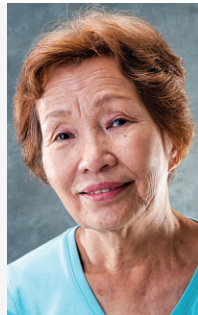
